

GOTCHA! - Synopsis

Marley Roberts is released from Prison after a 15 year sentence for Armed Robbery. Of the four-man Gang, only Marley and Leka Shkodran served time. Irishman Michael O'Neil and Well Spoken Fred evaded capture. Officially the stolen money was never recovered. Marley suspects either Michael or Fred were working with the Opposition – that is corrupt Detective Toni Cappa. Michael and Fred deny the insinuation but Marley plants video surveillance equipment in their homes just in case...

Marley teams up with Roscoe, a fellow inmate of Indian descent who is an IT Expert. They plan to hack into Cappa's Off-Shore Bank Account and steal back, the stolen money that was stolen from them. Shortly after his release Marley goes to work for ex-villain Terry Crooks who runs a firm of Private Investigators all of whom are ex-convicts. Who better to go after the bad guys than ex-bad guys? On his first assignment, Marley discovers a Night Club - a Celebrity-Look-A-Like Escort Service – a Knocking Shop for the masses.

Assisted by the Gang, Marley breaks into Cappa's house. They discover a haul of drugs in Cappa's safe. Unwittingly, they trigger the silent alarm and Marley is arrested. Cappa secures his release but wants the contents of the safe returned or else things could get unpleasant. The Gang decide to cut the illicit haul, give five kilos back to Cappa and keep five kilos. Michael and Well-spoken Fred get greedy and cut the gang's 5 kilos yet again. Enter Captain Birdseye, a seriously disturbed Escapee who turns up on Marley's doorstep and has decided that he must use his mentally challenged condition as a force for good.

Cappa realizes he has been short-changed and sends rent-a-thugs Donnie Harris and Pete Walker to recover the missing 50%. In an attempt to hack into Cappa's computer, Roscoe builds a bogus website for the Celebrity-Look-A-Like Escort Service. Cappa takes the bait; his computer cache is searched and reveals the ID of an Off-Shore bank account and a chance of some real cash – but Cappa cottons on to the ruse. In response, Cappa's rent-a-thugs, Donnie and Pete force Well-Spoken-Fred to reveal the location of the missing 5 kilos. While the gang are debriefing in a lock-up garage, Cappa and the forces of law and order raid the premises. The 5 kilos are in the fridge – for the gang it's all over – busted. But, the fridge is empty. Cappa leaves empty handed. Captain Birdseye on a righteous mission has thrown the 5 kilos of cocaine in a canal – much to the relief of the gang. But Michael and Fred are distributing a further 5 kilos in their respective social circles much to the displeasure of Paul Cozzi, the Alpha Dog of the London criminal underworld who uses an industrial meat grinder to dispose of his competitors. Things get even more precarious when Cozzi hires Marley and Roscoe to track down a gang who have built a bogus website for his Celebrity-Look-A-Like Escort Service.

Still searching for the missing 50%, Donnie and Pete turn their attention to Roscoe. He is about to be permanently disfigured at the lock-up garage when the interrogation is interrupted by Captain Birdseye. Donnie and Pete prove no match for the psychotic, Kung Fu expert who believes he has a direct line to God. The tables are turned. Marley and Captain Birdseye interrogate Donnie and Pete. Under duress, they reveal the identity of Cappa's Supergrass – both living off the proceeds of criminal activity committed by honest villains. Cozzi the Alpha Dog is not happy - which has unpleasant consequences for the Supergrass.

Detective Cappa crosses one line too many when he tries to frame Well-Spoken Fred and Michael eventually points Marley towards the real traitor in the gang - Gotcha! – afraid not..
